Significant day for the I-95 Corridor and South Carolina's Global Logistics Triangle

Wednesday, March 5, 2014: The Jafza Executive team and SCDOT Officials met at the South Carolina Department of Commerce on Monday, March 3 to execute the paperwork for the new Interchange at I-95 (Exit 97) and US-301 Extension to SC Hwy 6.

The approximately US\$40+ million project will be the eastern anchor of South Carolina's Global Logistics Triangle (I-26 US-301 I-95) and represents one of the largest projects undertaken by SCDOT in recent history.

Jafza demonstrated their commitment to the region and the Jafza South Carolina project by donating 43 acres of land to the state in order to facilitate the development of this project, which will offer improved connectivity to over 2,000 acres for commercial and industrial development. Construction contracts have been awarded, and construction is expected to commence within the next 30-45 days.

The delegation of Jafza and Economic Zones World (EZW), the parent company of Jafza, was led by His Excellency Hisham Abdulla Al Shirawi, Chairman of the EZW Board and Vice Chairman of Dubai Chamber of Commerce; Her Excellency Salma Hareb, Group CEO of the Jafza and EZW; Asim Al Abbasi, CFO; and Samir Chaturvedi, the head of EZW's Global Development.

In emphasizing Jafza's dedication to the South Carolina project, Al Shirawi congratulated the local leadership and the community at large on bringing the milestone project to fruition. In addition to improving connectivity to the larger area of Santee and the Jafza project site, the project will have larger socio-economic benefits in promoting growth and development in the local community.

"We are very impressed with the business friendly attitude of the Government of the state of South Carolina and the local authorities of Orangeburg, which adds to our confidence and vision for the Jafza South Carolina project" Al Shirawi said.

Salma Hareb further emphasized the importance of continued collaborative efforts of the state, the community and organizations like Jafza in reigniting the growth engines of the region. "Backed by Jafza's experience in developing and managing industrial and logistics Zones and the State's commitment towards improved multimodal connectivity though ports, road and rail, we have a very positive project evolving in Santee, South Carolina" she said.

"The success of our economic development efforts hinges on our inventory of good sites, buildings and parks," said Secretary of Commerce Bobby Hitt. "Working with our partners at the county and local levels, it is crucial to have quality product to show prospects looking to locate or expand in South Carolina. Having and keeping a robust inventory across the state is one of our top priorities."

"The South Carolina Department of Transportation (SCDOT) has been working diligently to develop this project since its initial funding. The prospect of developing this portion of Orangeburg County has drawn the support of leaders from the local, state and federal levels. Jafza's recent visit to execute agreements and tour the project site shows their commitment to develop their proposed industrial facility adjacent to the I-95 / US 301 Interchange and SC 6 Connector also expedites our contractor's efforts to begin construction on the project. SCDOT is genuinely excited to see this project come together for the benefit of Orangeburg County, its citizens and the state of South Carolina." Mr. Gregg Robinson, Executive Director of the Orangeburg County Development Commission said: "The development of the interchange will create one of the best logistical parks in the Southeast. The 1,300+/- acres represent a true 'mega site' unlike any other in the State. This will greatly assist the Port of Charleston and the SC Department of Commerce by providing a quality industrial location that is strategically located near the port and the I-95 Corridor. At the end of the day, capital investment leads to jobs and a better quality of living for our citizens. We must have the needed infrastructure in place at the right time to answer the call of business around the Globe. This is a primary reason why Team South Carolina is and will continue to be a leader in the recruitment of business and industry in the southeast."
